He stated a large portion of the increase is for waterway 51 management to repair the pond bank erosion. 52 53 Supervisor Miller explained to the audience why the budget needed to be increased to repair the 54 pond erosion. 55 Supervisor Ward also explained in depth to the audience that several ponds have erosion issues that 56 is also impacting the storm drain system for the whole community and it would possibly take over 57 58 five years to repair the ponds that currently have issues. 59 Supervisor Miller spoke briefly about the status of Envera installing the new security cameras and 60 61 the facility janitorial service. 62 C.
